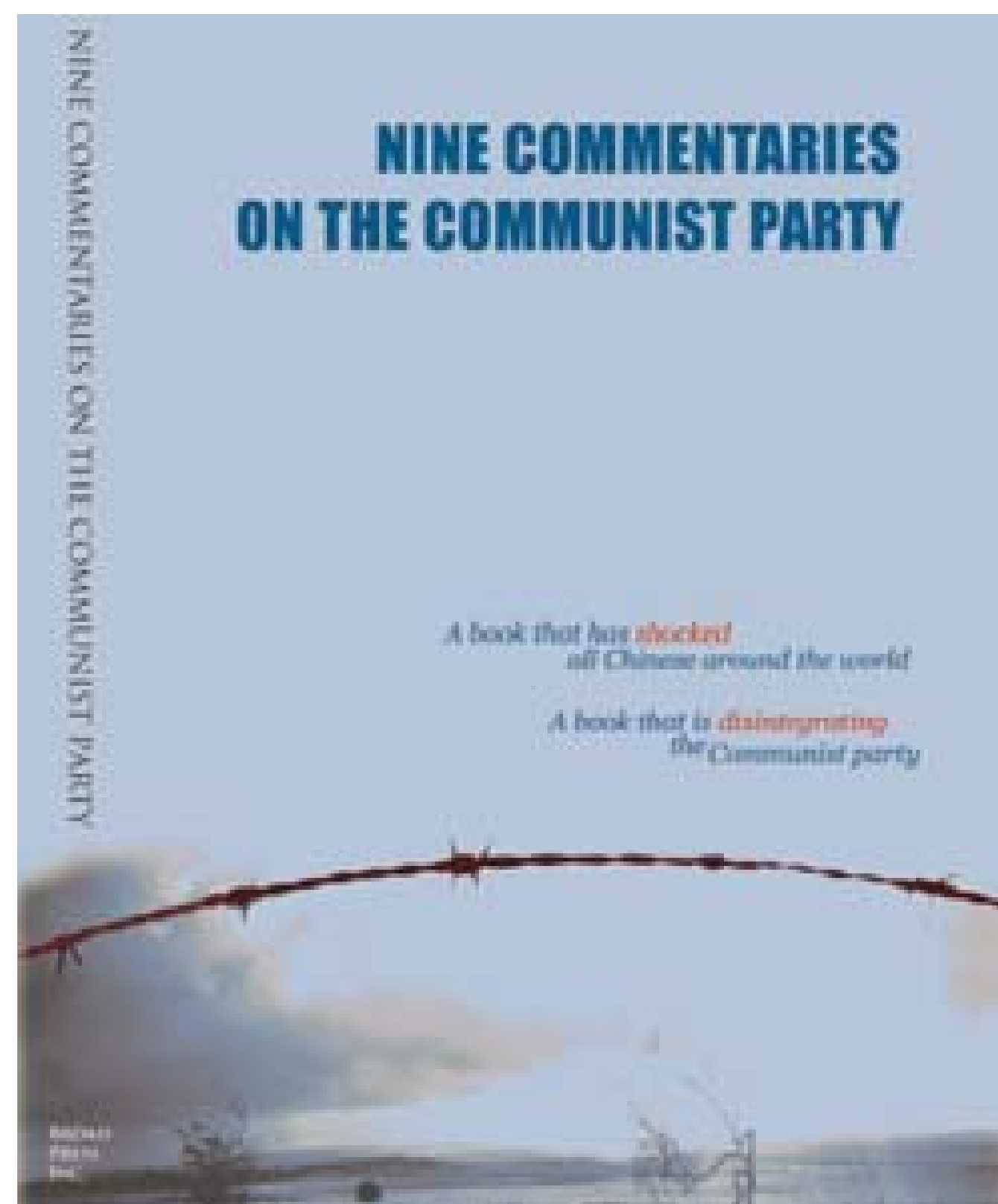

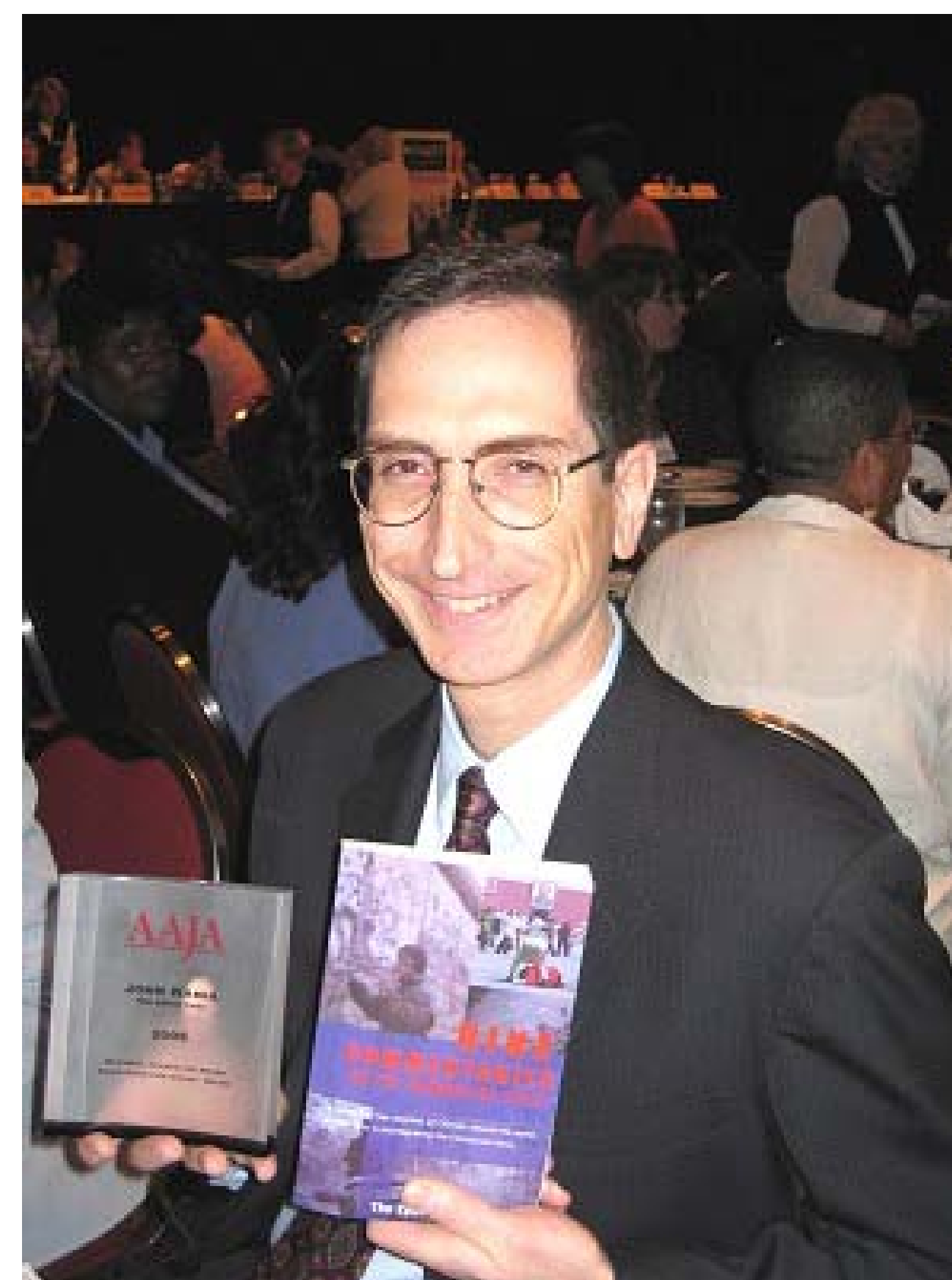
Nine Commentaries on The Communist Party **has Been Translated into More Than 20 Languages**

600,000 Copies Distributed in Hong Kong in Two Weeks

“About two weeks ago in Hong Kong, *The Epoch Times* printed a special edition of all nine commentaries on the Communist Party. On the first day they printed 30,000 copies. They then distributed all 30,000 within two hours time. The next day, *The Epoch Times* printed 30,000 more copies. People were waiting to take them, and they were all gone in less than 2 hours. On the third day, *The Epoch Times* printed 60,000 copies. The demand was even higher, and all the papers were quickly gone. Finally, *The Epoch Times* printed 250,000 copies. Incredibly, they were all snatched up in less than four hours time. At this point, *The Epoch Times* began to run out of paper. Nevertheless, it has found ways to keep printing, and in the last two weeks has distributed 600,000 copies of the Nine Commentaries. Hong Kong has 6 million residents, which would suggest one in every ten Hong Kong residents now has a copy of the Nine Commentaries. On the other hand, Hong Kong also has 40,000 tourists who visit from mainland China everyday. Everyday these tourists are taking the Nine Commentaries back to China, where they are banned.”

According to incomplete statistics, as of November 19, 2005, more than 840 activities concerning the “Nine Commentaries” and quitting the CCP have been held world-wide and have been reported on *The Epoch Times*’ multi-lingual website. These activities included over 441 indoor seminars and over 428 outdoor demonstrations and gatherings. They spanned 120 municipalities of 39 countries in five continents, with 31 of them held in national capitals. Altogether, the number of participating organizations totaled 3,775 (including those that participated more than once) and 3,414 formal speakers. 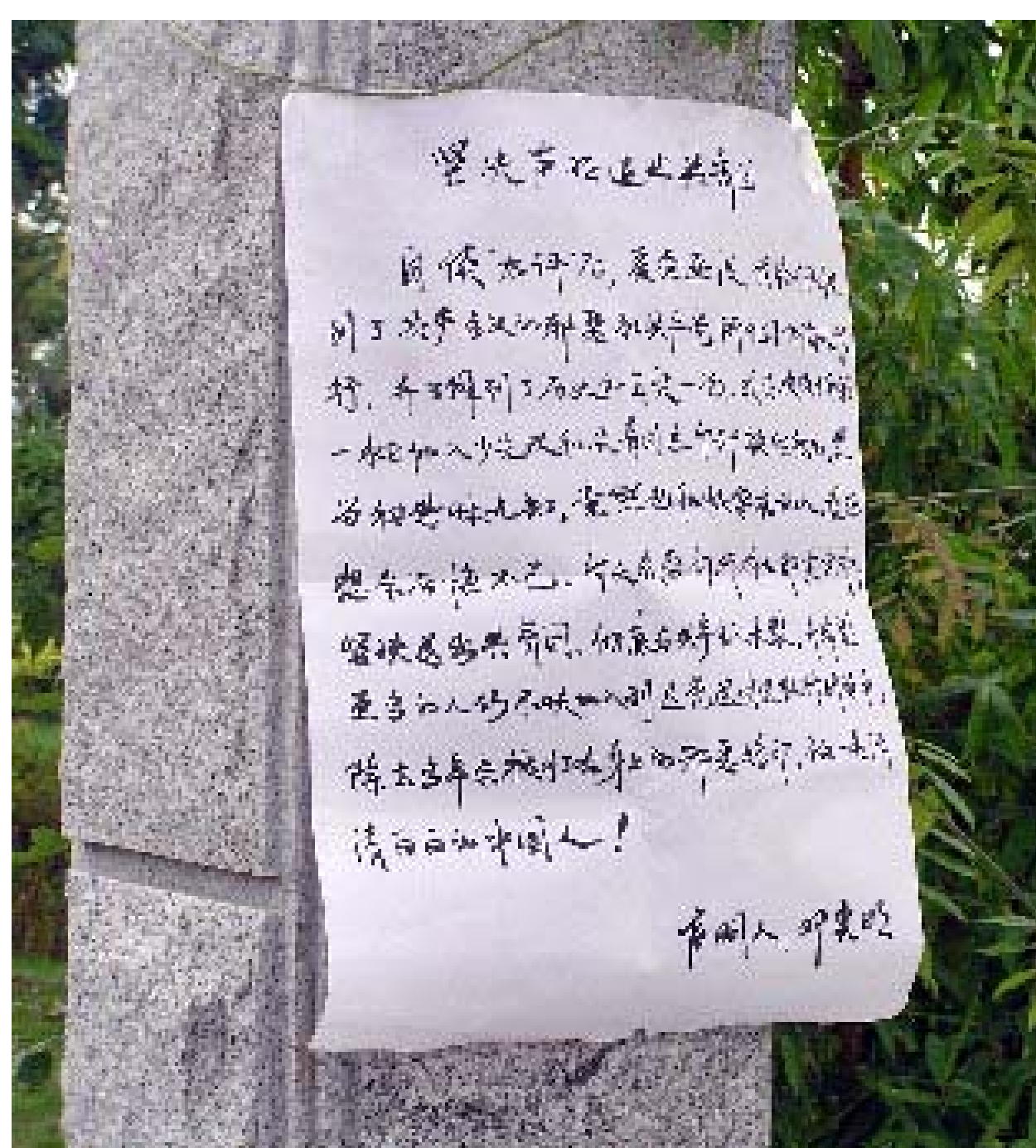

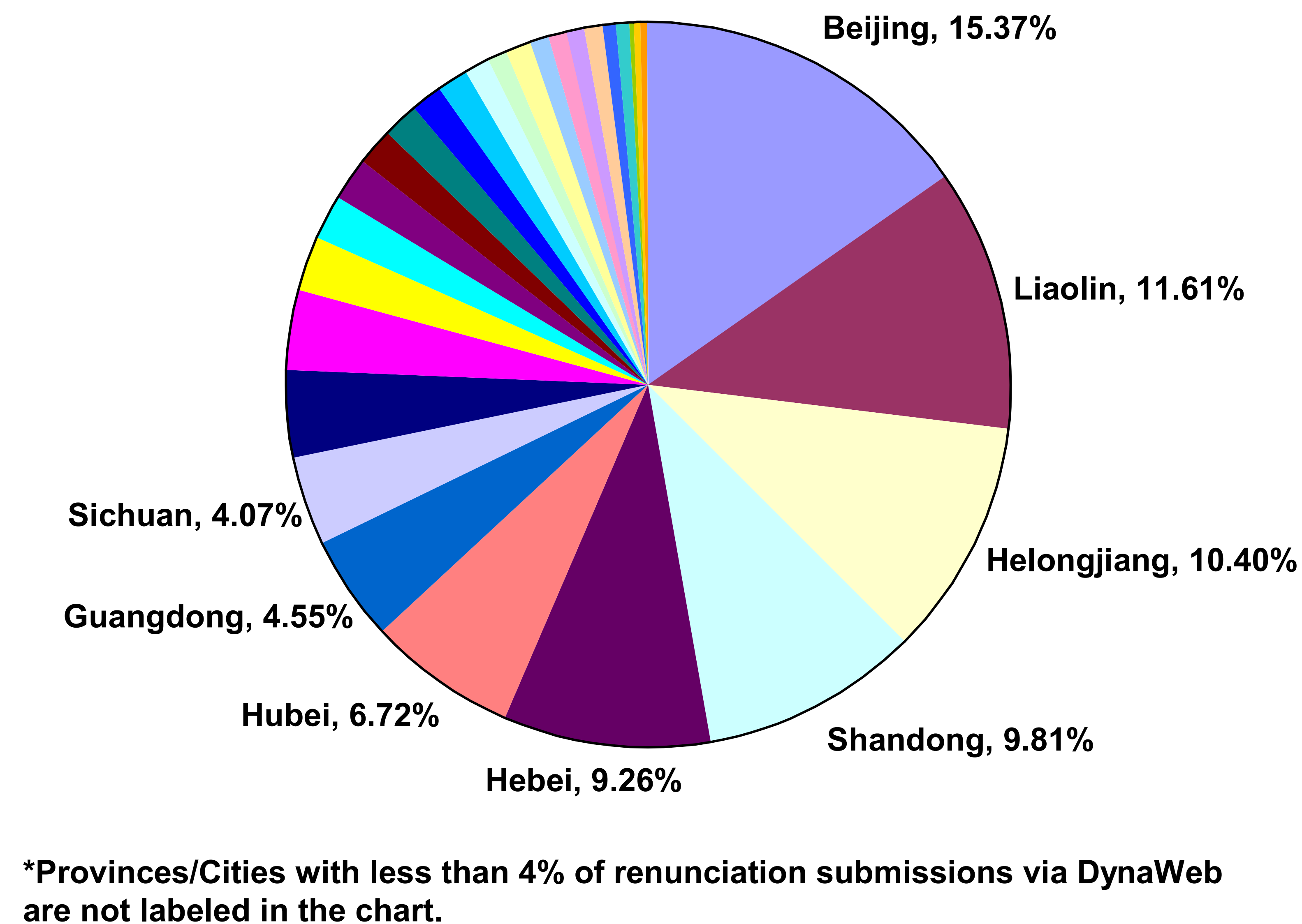

Demographics of Renunciations from the CCP Through April 2005



After reading the “Nine Commentaries”, many communist party members inside and outside China have renounced their membership one after another: through the internet, through letters, through phone calls by relatives or friends outside of China and by publicly posting statements. On December 3, 2004, a special website (www.tuidang.org) was set up to collect the statements of people renouncing membership of the CCP, the Communist Youth League and other Communist led organizations. On November 24, 2005, more than 5,8 million people registered their renunciation via that special website. Currently, resignations from the CCP are occurring at a rate of 20,000 per day. Renouncing the CCP is an act that requires great courage because Chinese people who renounce their CCP membership risk: job loss and illegal arrest and detention in labour camps or jails

It is fair to say that the present situation in China is comparable to that of the eve of the fall of the Berlin Wall in East Germany; it also resembles the dawn of the breakdown of the Iron Curtain under the former Soviet dictatorship. The free world eventually must face the question of how to cope with the collapse of the Chinese Communist dictatorship and how to ensure China’s smooth transition to a non-Communist society.

Demographics of Renunciations

People from 29 provinces or directly governed cities submitted renunciation statements online via DynaWeb. People from Beijing are especially active: 15% of the total.

CCP's Response to the "Nine Commentaries"

The Chinese Communist Party's (CCP) mouthpieces, *Xinhua News Agency* and the *People's Daily* newspaper, have not openly responded to the "Nine Commentaries", fearing that any public comment would serve as a catalyst for further spreading the "Nine Commentaries" to the curious readers in mainland China.

The CCP recently posted an article titled "Can The Epoch Times' Nine Commentaries Really Destroy the Communist Party?" on its so-called China Anti-Cult website. The article refers to the "Nine Commentaries" as "the most serious challenge the Chinese government has ever faced in the (CCP's) history", indirectly admitting to its deep fear and the widespread panic inside the Party.

Nationwide Campaign to Stabilize the CCP



Starting in January, it launched a nation-wide campaign of "Maintaining the Advancement of the Communist Party". The campaign is

aims to keep the Party from disintegrating. All CCP members are required to be registered by July 1, 2005. Everyday there are reports on Xinhua on cities where activities for this campaign are being held. Often these activities are accompanied by veteran CCP members raising their right hand to swear: "...I can sacrifice my life for communism..." to the red flag again.

Harvard Report: Shows that the Most Frequently Blocked Topic on the Internet in China is the "Nine Commentaries on the Communist Party"



John Palfrey, Executive Director of the Berkman Center for Internet & Society at Harvard Law School, testified before the U.S. – China Economic and Security Review Commission Hearing on China's State Control Mechanisms and Methods on April 14.

When testing a critique on the Chinese Communist Party, titled *Nine Commentaries on the Chinese Communist Party*, 90% of the Chinese-language websites were blocked, and 82% of sites tested with a derogatory version of former CCP leader Jiang Zemin's name were blocked.

Arrests of Falun Gong Practitioners and Pro-Democracy Activists

Chinese state security has arrested some renowned independent writers in China and set out to find the authors of "The Nine Commentaries". Control over the Chinese Internet and other media were tightened. Many dissidents have also been arrested for speaking out to support those renouncing the CCP. Everyone is being interrogated about their withdrawal from the CCP and its related organizations.

According to reports from a number of sources, a systematic arrest of Falun Gong practitioners was carried out throughout China in April. Many Falun Gong practitioners are distributing the *Nine Commentaries on the Communist Party* inside China and some political commentators consider such arrests to be the first public response by the CCP to this editorial series of *Nine Commentaries on the Communist Party*.



The Chinese Communist Party interrogated the renowned independent writer Zheng Yichun in the wake of the Nine Commentaries' publishing. They suspect that Mr. Zheng is the author of the Nine Commentaries.



On August 2, 2005, the Chinese Communist Party sentenced the renowned independent writer Zhang Lin from Anhui province to five years in prison for "instigating subversion of state power." Two papers by Zhang Lin in support of the Nine Commentaries were cited in the verdict.

On May 29, 10,000 Americans Signing in DC

On May 29, the day before Memorial Day, in Washington DC, more than 10,000 westerners signed petitions to support Chinese people withdrawing from the Chinese Communist Party (CCP) and to urge the CCP to immediately stop arresting people who have withdrawn from the CCP and to respect the Chinese people's freedom of choice. The US Secretary of Defense, Donald H. Rumsfeld, also signed to show his support. Citizens from Cuba, Ukraine and other former Communist countries also signed to give support.

Information on the Nine Commentaries and Quitting the CCP is Spread

Chinese people can access the “Nine Commentaries” and quit the CCP via the Internet, email, phone, fax from overseas and at service centers in different countries. In cities across mainland China, people have posted declarations renouncing their CCP membership on telephone poles, pay phone booths, apartment doors, public walls, public benches, bus stops and buses. As a result, the “Nine Commentaries” has spread widely in China. On March 29, 2005, regular programming on several TV stations in Jinan city of Shandong province was interrupted by broadcast of a documentary film version of the “Nine Commentaries”. The film called on any Communist Party members who still have a conscience to quit the CCP. According to viewers from Jinan city, regular state-controlled broadcasting was interrupted for more than 10 minutes.
